As Bourse Chair for 2012, Cliff has been investigating other venues for shows and/or appraisals. The Elks Club would cost \$700 for rent and set-up and hold about 50 table spaces. Membership felt this would be very expensive if we had both a spring and fall show. It was also proposed changing to a 'Collectorama Show' which might include collectables such as stamps, more tokens & medals, jewelry, and baseball cards. Members were concerned there was not sufficient time to get vendor commitments and properly advertise to have a successful spring show in 2012.

Membership being divided on these options, decide to table the discussion so the new Officers and Board could plan the 2012-2013 calendar for appraisals and shows, and make recommendations to the membership on these issues in January/February.

1793 S-4 With Periods Chain Cent, MS65 Brown The Cleneay-Atwater-Eliasberg Specimen Breen Plate Coin



A one-cent copper coin minted in 1793, the first year that the United States produced its own coins, has fetched \$1 million at a Florida auction.

The Orlando Sentinel reports

(http://thesent.nl/xZBfyw) that the final bid by an unknown buyer for the coin was one of the largest sales at the Florida United Numismatics coin show and annual convention.

The newspaper reported that the 1793 penny was sold at such a high price because it is rare and in excellent shape, showing no wear on its lettering, its Lady Liberty face or the wreath on its back.

El Yunque National Park Quarter

Are you ready for a little trip to the tropics? How about Puerto Rico? The 11th quarter in the America the Beautiful Quarters[®] Program honors El Yunque National Forest, located in Puerto Rico, a U.S. territory in the tropical Caribbean Islands. You'll find the Coqui frog and the Puerto Rican parrot featured on El Yunque's quarter.

This parrot, a symbol of Puerto Rican history and national pride, is a native of Puerto Rico, not naturally found anywhere else in the world. Yet it was once in danger of becoming extinct. The species was listed as endangered as the total population dropped below 25 birds.

How did this bird become so rare, even in its native land? It was facing dangers and obstacles like predators, competitors, hurricanes, hunting, and most importantly, destruction of its forest habitat.

To address this crisis, a breeding program was started in 1972. The program grew to include several agencies working

together to increase the population of this parrot. And conserving its rainforest habitat has the benefit of conserving other important resources, such as water, soils, and forests.

As a result of this cooperation among agencies, the Puerto Rican parrot has a good chance of being restored. In 2009, there were more than 50 wild parrots between El Yunque and a neighboring forest, and about 245 more being raised in captivity.
